Our literacy focus on non-fiction has seen our class uncover some very interesting facts about spiders. Did you know that spiders have blue blood? This week and next week students will be putting all the knowledge they have gathered about the structure of non-fiction text to hard work as they complete their own project about an animal of their choice. Students work will be on display on the upcoming open school morning on Friday 17th of May. 
morning.

Maths


We have been investigating the different aspects of measurement. Comparing objects in length, using informal units (everyday objects) to measure chosen items around the room. Making estimates about how much an object will hold and its mass. Students have also been looking into the importance of knowing 'friends of 10 facts' for example 3 + 7 = 10, 4 + 6 = 10 and how this knowledge is very useful when working with bigger numbers.

Grades 3/6

What a great fortnight we have had in the Rocking Roo's classroom.

The students have been building up their running stamina for our Cluster Athletics this Wednesday. In Auslan, we have been

practicing signing the National Anthem. We are hoping for the students to be able to perform this at assembly in a few weeks' time. On Friday they enjoyed a whole school STEM challenge with their buddies. They had to design and build a boat that would float out of selected materials. The students will continue to test these models and see if they last other conditions like wind or waves plus if they can stay floating for 24hrs.

OUR LEARNING FOCUS:

Literacy: In Reading, we have been analysing how authors portray their perspective and use techniques to influence our opinions. The students have investigated credible sources of information, how articles have irrelevant and relevant information in them. They have analysed the importance of the information we read and can be influenced by. They have been given a selected novel to finish by the end of this term and a reading journal to complete activities on their book. We are hoping to foster a love for reading and spark their reading interests!

The students have been working through our writing traits to develop and publish their persuasive piece. We have been looking at using persuasive techniques to enhance our persuasive writing like using emotive language, repetition, punctuation, evidence, and rhetorical questions. Our persuasive writing pieces are on display in the library space if you wish to have a read and be persuaded.





Numeracy: We have been practicing subtraction strategies to solve problems such as split strategy, using number lines and algorithms with and without renaming. The students have been using estimation and rounding to solve money problems in real life situations.

Inquiry: In 'Our Island Home' unit the students have been making a map of an island and adding relevant points of importance or significance. We have been investigating how places

get their names or why they have those names and the meaning behind it. They have also designed a flag for there island!

Respectful Relationships: We have been practicing team building games establishing cooperation, problem solving and positive talk.
